Dear Parents,

Thank you for your support in adapting to home learning. We have attached a copy of this week's timetable and encourage students to look through the tasks thoroughly before embarking on their week of learning. We will be using Google Classroom again as a tool to discuss, share and provide feedback on tasks.
