School Uniform

Parents and staff maintain strong and ongoing support for the wearing of the school uniform as a means of fostering school identity and tone. At Sutton Public School students are expected to wear the appropriate uniform at all times. It should be noted that according to the NSW Department of Education Policy (DoE Core Rules), students are expected to "Maintain a neat appearance, including adhering to the requirements of the school's uniform or dress code policy".



Our school strongly encourages the wearing of the school uniform. This uniform has been selected in consultation with the school community and is considered to be smart, comfortable, and easy to wash and reasonably priced.

Footwear is an important safety item. Shoes with a good sole can improve grip on surfaces and can assist in preventing accidents such as slips, trips and falls from occurring. Footwear can also provide a protective barrier and protect feet from injury caused by falling objects or spillages.

Sutton Public School students are asked to wear black shoes that fully enclose the feet, including the upper section of the foot. It is recommended that the shoe has a stout sole.

With the exception of medical alert bracelets and necklaces, jewellery should not be worn. This is a safety issue in the playground. Student with pierced ears are requested to wear studs.

The school uniform shop is open on Monday to Friday from 8.45am until 2.30pm. Second-hand uniform is available from the ice cream shed. However, due to the size of the school the clothing available is limited.

Are you planning on going to the Murrumbateman Field Days? Sutton School needs your help!

For the last five years Sutton Primary School P&C has been given the opportunity to run the Parcel Delivery Service at the Murrumbateman Field Days. This is a great fundraiser for our school with the potential to raise a lot of money. We are running it again this year and we need lots of volunteers. Field Days management have asked us to run two cars again this year which requires a considerable number of volunteers.

This will be a great opportunity to meet other parents and raise some funds for the school. We can make this year the best one yet. If you are not sure go on the field days website... It looks like another amazing year this year.

What is it?

When Field Day Patrons purchase items from Stalls that they don't want to carry around all day, they phone our service. We send a ute to the stall, collect the item and take the item to one of our Pick-up Bases at two entrance gates. Later when the patron is ready to leave they drive their car to the entrance gate and pick up their item and pay a fee.

When is it?

Saturday, 20th and Sunday, 21st October 2018

What will volunteers have to do?

We need at least two people per car - collecting goods from stalls and dropping them off at the Pick-up Base. We also need people to man the Pick-up Base - taking phone requests for pick up and checking collections. There will be an appointed coordinator (Sophie Davis) on hand to manage everything over both days.

How long will you need to be there?

We are running 3 x 3hr shifts per day
