## **Principal's Report**

Welcome back to Term 4. We hope our students have had a safe and relaxing break. Our teachers have been working hard to organise an exciting term full of celebration and appreciation of learning. Our year will end with our Infants and Primary Presentation Ceremonies, and of course, our much loved School Concert and Year 6 Farewell.

During the term, students will have the opportunity to participate in a range of extra-curricular activities. Students in Years 3-6 will have the opportunity to participate in the Boorowa Touch and Netball competition. I would like to thank Mr Mitchell for organising this event. This year 75 of our students will be participating.

In Week 3, students will enjoy the Musica Viva performance in the school hall. Thank you to Mrs Frame for this organisation and preparing our students so well during their weekly music lessons.

In Weeks 3 and 4, we will welcome our new 2019 Kindergarten students to our school. Mrs Blencowe and Miss Gould have been working hard to organise our Kindy Activity Mornings. Our Year 4 students do an excellent job as buddies for our Kindergarten students supporting them in a successful transition to school.

This term, Year 5 students will have the opportunity to run for School Captain or Prefect in 2019. The process for this will begin in Week 3. Students and teachers will meet to discuss the process. Following this meeting, students will write a letter to the principal explaining why they would be a good fit for Captain or Prefect in 2019. Ms Pritchard will reply to each student encouraging them to prepare a speech for a special assembly that will be held in Week 8. Following this assembly, students in Years 1-6 will vote for our 2019 School Captains and Prefects. The successful students will be announced at our Primary Presentation Night.

Transition to High School programs begin this term for our Year 6 students. As our students attend such a wide range of schools, including ACT schools it is important that you contact your chosen high school if you have any questions about times and dates of activity days. We do our very best to stay informed about these days however, information is not sent directly to our school. In addition, please find information about the Selective High Schools process for 2020 attached to this newsletter.

We will be hosting several staff training sessions, some of these include Online Safety and Teaching Children with Autism. Parents will have the opportunity to attend 2 workshops this term, which are being held on Monday of Week 4. We will be holding an Online Safety workshop for parents from 6-7pm followed by an "Understanding NAPLAN" workshop from 7-8pm. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in the Online Safety Workshop during the school day on Monday in Week 4. More information will be coming home soon.

Student reports will go home in Week 9. We do not hold formal parent meetings in Term 4, however if you have any questions please make a time to see your child's classroom teacher before the end of term.

Our PAVE lessons will also continue each fortnight and Miss Robinson will continue to lead our PAVE assemblies in Weeks 3 and 8. Our first two PAVE lessons will focus on "Being Bucket Fillers". Miss Robinson first taught this concept and the students understand the idea well. This term we are going to make sure we are "Bucket Fillers" not "Bucket Dippers".

Uniform orders can be exchanged if the size isn't right as long as all of the packaging is intact. Your cooperation is appreciated.





# Bucket Fillers



## What is the "bucket"?

The bucket represents your mental and emotional self.

## How do you feel when your bucket is full?

When your bucket is full, you feel more confident, secure, calm, patient, and friendly. Your thoughts are positive and you expect positive results. Have you ever felt better after someone gave you a friendly smile or happy grin? This is the "ripple effect" of a full bucket.

## How do you feel when your bucket is empty?

When your bucket is empty, it contains few, if any, positive thoughts or feelings. When your bucket is empty you can easily become sad, negative, insecure, nervous, angry, depressed, stressed, worried, afraid, or physically ill. An empty bucket can affect your behaviour and cause you to express your emotions in a way that empties the buckets of those around you.

## What is Bucket Filling?

Actions or words that show that you care about someone. Saying or doing something kind. Giving someone a heartfelt smile. Using names with respect. Helping without being asked. Giving sincere compliments. Showing respect to others. There are hundreds of wonderful ways to fill buckets.

## What is Bucket Dipping?

Making fun of someone. Saying or doing unkind things. Refusing to help. Failing to show respect or being intentionally disrespectful. This is a partial list of ways in which it's possible to dip into another's bucket.

## What does "Use Your Lid" Mean?

The "lid" represents a mental shield against anything that would dip into your bucket. As you practice using your lid, you will build the necessary resilience to work through life's challenges.

## Why is the bucket concept helpful?

The bucket concept is simple and profound. It has created a new and simple language that everyone can understand and learn. i.e. *You filled my bucket!* Understanding the motivation behind behaviour and realising that we can choose to be bucket fillers are powerful tools for positive change.






