This professional learning is aligned with our School Plan 2018-2020. Several of the schools in our network are a part of the "Curiosity and Powerful Learning: School Improvement Program". Curiosity and Powerful Learning is a program based on school improvement. All schools, including high performing schools, must engage in ongoing improvement to ensure students achieve their potential. We must raise standards into the medium and long term and at the same time enhance the learning skills, the spirit of enquiry or curiosity of our students. Successful school improvement must involve the whole school from the principal to the students and the school community. This program is a two-year program providing school improvement teams with theoretical knowledge, tools and frameworks to implement processes to develop the pedagogical skills of teachers.

Today 75 Stage 2 and 3 students travelled to the Boorowa Touch Football and Netball Carnival. I would like to thank Mr Mitchell for the organisation of this event and also Miss Steele, Mr Dunn, Mr Reed and Miss Scott for attending the carnival. We have also been lucky enough to welcome Miss Riley to our school in a casual position. Miss King, Miss Adcock and Miss Riley have been excellent in supporting our classes this week with the continuation of teaching and learning programs.

We look forward to the beginning of our Kindy Activity Mornings next Tuesday and Thursday, our much loved PAVE assembly next Wednesday and our Year 6 Fire Visit next Friday.

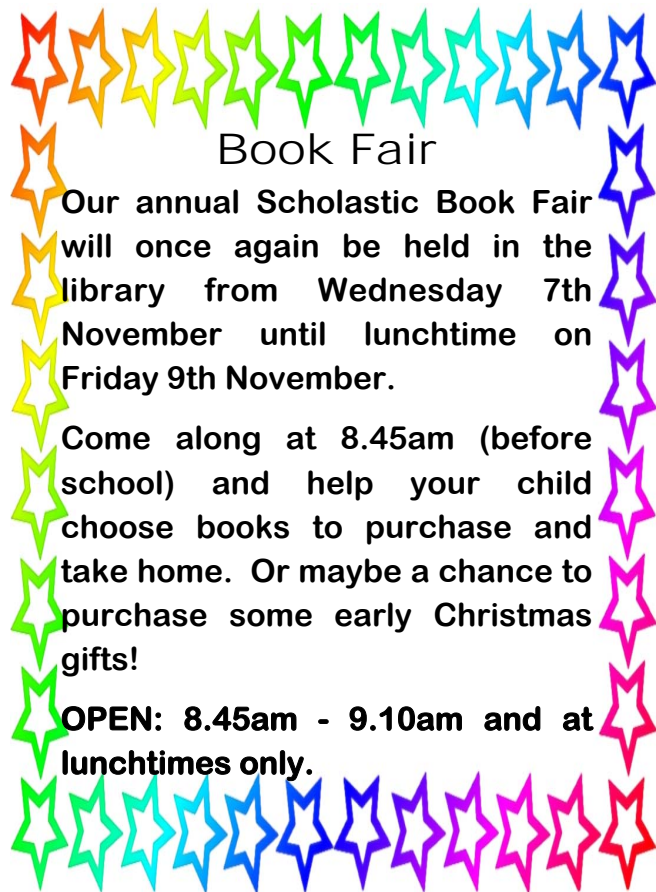

Honour Their Spirit Commemorating the Centenary of Armistice 2018 REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE SUTTON PUBLIC SCHOOL

100 years to the day since the Armistice of Compiegne was signed between the Allies and Germany signifying the end of the First World War, Sutton will commemorate the occasion. The Remembrance Day service will take place at 3.00pm at the Memorial Gates at Sutton Public School. The service, led by Ven Dr Royce Thompson will include prayers, hymns and the laying of wreaths and poppies.

Following the service, tea and coffee will be served at the RFS shed before we return to the Memorial Gates for a special tribute.

At 4.45pm, Sutton will unite with hundreds of other communities along the eastern seaboard of Australia to honour those who served. Our piper, Chris Lindesay, along with other Australian pipe bands and pipers will play 'The Battle's O'er', the tune composed a century ago to remember those who served and paid the supreme sacrifice.

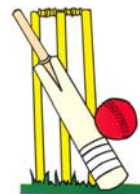
Bungendore Swimming Club

Assure the student that the problem will be addressed and then provide ongoing support.

Investigate the problems raised.
Treat everyone involved with fairness.

Take action that is appropriate to the particular circumstances – this may be:

- o Mediation
- o Disciplinary action
- o Warnings
- o Social skills lessons
- o Counselling
- o Parental involvement

IF YOUR CHILD IS BEING BULLIED

- tell him/her ...
- It is not their fault
- He or she has the right to feel safe and happy
- He or she has the right not to be bullied
- It is all right to walk away
- It can be stopped
- It is all right to tell the school staff
- By acting on the bullying you are also protecting other students from the bully.

WHAT IS BULLYING?

Bullying is repeated verbal, physical, social or psychological behaviour that is harmful and involves the misuse of power by an individual or group towards one or more persons.

Cyberbullying refers to bullying through information and communication technologies.

Conflict or fights between equals or single incidents are not defined as bullying.

Bullying is a deliberate attempt to make your child feel uncomfortable, unhappy or unsafe.

To help your school be a safe and happy place for your child, it is important that you work with the school to solve any bullying problem.

Bullies can be anywhere...at school, at work, even neighbours. It is important that your child learns to deal with bullies.

Sutton Public School has zero tolerance for bullying. But remember, if we don't know about it, we can't help.



BULLYING CAN BE ...repeatedly

- ☐ Giving nasty looks
- ☐ Making rude gestures
- ☐ Calling names
- ☐ Being rude and impolite
- ☐ Spreading stories and rumours
- ☐ Teasing
- ☐ Keeping someone out of a group
- ☐ Acting in an unpleasant way near someone
- ☐ Hurting someone physically
- ☐ 'Mucking about' that goes too far
- ☐ Harassment
- ☐ Any form of discrimination based on disability, gender, race or religion.



WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP

- Assure your child that the problem will be addressed
- Let the school know that your child is being bullied by contacting your child's class teacher, Assistant Principal or Principal
- Remain calm at all times, especially in front of your child
- Communicate and co-operate with the school until the problem is solved
- Bullies often have poor social skills and sometimes do not know how to behave towards others in a positive way
- Develop your child's sense of humour and tolerance of others
- Ensure your approach is kept positive. The last thing your child would need is to see you take a 'bullying' approach and compound the situation.
- Positively reinforce your child's self-esteem and sense of self worth
- Develop your child's social skills by teaching him or her to share and to co-operate with others in group situations.
